Pastor's Corner

Happy Summer!!! I hope you are happy and in love!

I was at church yesterday with three of you working on schedules, sound and set up: a fun time for sure with wonderful spirits. During our varied conversation one of my companions excitedly said: "Hey, I read this yesterday: 'Hope is not a feeling, it is a discipline' Isn't that so great?" Isn't it indeed!! So great I decided yesterday to center this newsletter around hope in some fashion.

So, I pondered the rest of the day and during some of those awake moments in the night about how to unwrap hope as discipline. We have talked about Love and Compassion as actions, so hope should be much like those emotions - better for us and our community in practice rather than just a feeling.

And then, upon waking, I turned to this morning's Center for Action and Contemplation's daily meditation which was about.... you guessed it - <u>HOPE</u>.

Life is so fun sometimes!

<u>Hope Makes Room for Love</u> was penned by Retired Episcopal bishop and Choctaw citizen, Steven Charleston, who draws on his Native American experience to navigate collective crisis.

He writes to us: "We inhabit a period in history that seems to be filled with conflict. The world has become an uncertain place, a dark place, where we cannot see what may happen next. All we know, based on our recent experience, is that things could—and probably will—get worse...."

He describes how for millennia his ancestors followed a spiritual path that was respectful of the earth, inclusive of all humanity, and visionary in its transformative power. He tells us of how his people's faith was sorely tried yet continues to this day despite every hardship and persecution they have been forced to endure.

He concludes with these thoughts: "Hope makes room for love in the world. We can all share it, we can all believe in it, even if we are radically different in every other way...We can hope together—therefore, hope liberates us. It frees us from our fear of the other. It opens our eyes to see love all around us. When we decide to embrace hope—we release a flow of energy that cannot be overcome. Hope is a light that darkness can never contain."

Couldn't have been said any better, so I hope you will join us just the way you are soon and often so we can practice the discipline of hope!


