Greetings friends and family!! What a spectacular week of sun we are going to experience. You know what they say -Have fun in the sun!!

Last Sunday we celebrated Pentecost. That day we were given the Holy Spirit and invited to be as one in spirit and in community. Our sanctuary was fittingly filled with bright, warm spirit reflecting the day and appropriately colored balloons (red, orange and yellow) floating above our heads. The Gathering Reading presented was a poem by Mary Oliver titled "At the River Clarion." It's first line is: "I don't know who God is exactly..." This sensuous poem is an ode to Mary's sense of who God might be. We read the first stanza as it was a nicely self-contained message for our day.

The thing I forgot to share with my fellow readers on Sunday was that we only read the <u>first</u> stanza. This poem is <u>seven</u> stanzas in length! The poem offers its readers an opportunity to find in Mary's luminous words images of things that might be God. It awaits you. If you listen, it might even be singing to you: A modern day Psalm.


This Sunday we will continue the worship series "I've been meaning to ask." Earlier in May we considered the question "Where are you from.." exploring ways we might learn to be open and trusting and share the common and unique parts of ourselves. A nice lead up to Pentecost.

This week's question is: "I've been meaning ask... where does it hurt?"

We are a wonderful caring community sharing our desires to acknowledge other's pain and sooth it. But what about ourselves?
