
In church last Sunday we considered the Trinity as presented to us in The Gospel of John. Early Church Fathers, after three centuries of discernment, created an early metaphor to capture some sense of John's multifaceted God. They said "God is a circle Dance." One of the earliest ways of speaking about and understanding the Trinity was the word *perichoresis*, meaning, "the divine dance" (from the Latin roots *peri* meaning "around" and *choreo* where we get the word choreography).

The Divine Dance, this flow of love created by the Trinity, calls us to express our lives with action. Our participation in the "divine dance" enables us to be generous, serve others, and experience connection, harmony, and love.

Let's Dance - for ourselves, for our children, for all God's children, and for our planet. Pick a dance, learn the steps, and take action. Every step, no matter how small, enhances God's choreography.

Life & Hope – Eben Ezer School Educating Children in Milot, Haiti







Thank you to Artie Finn for hosting this wonderful event, and to all her church mice who helped make it happen!





