In celebrating Reformation Sunday last week, we had the opportunity to reflect on the stories of our past: your stories and

our stories! I invite you to pause this week to reflect on a story of yours.

The season and a moment of reflection brought to mind a saying which is wood burned into the face of a dry sink my dad's parents gave to him and he gave to me. The saying is: "From Ghosties and Ghoulies and Long-Legged Beasties and Things That Go Bump in The Night; Good Lord Preserve Us." I also found it on an engraved plaque years ago.


