
- Session accepted 4 people for church membership.

- Set up and Clean up


Please sign up if you can attend so that we know how many to plan for. If you forget to make a reservation, join us anyway - we can always make room for more.


Our church has been actively participating in Church World Services' (CWS) Blankets and Tools Sunday since 1979. 45 YEARS!!!!!
