Welcome to November! The beginning of so much life! We feel the changes in our natural world continue and sharpen as that other season approaches, We begin our traditional holiday season with sales and services and the family and food of Thanksgiving and we begin a New Church Year with the onset of Advent! Good times, loving times, caring times.

Last Sunday I spoke of St. Francis of Assisi and the influences he has had on faith lives for more than 1,000 years. What is remarkable is that the ideas and practices Francis created are as relevant and fresh for today's faith as they were to 13th Century faith lives.

Francis' primary thesis is simple. *All of God's creation is sacred*. All living things, all of God's creatures, should to be honored, cherished, and respected.

He is known as the Patron Saint of Animals and the Environment. He lived a life in tune with nature, respecting and loving all things, finding God in the elements of creation right in front of him. *He experienced God in nature. He touched, sensed, and inhaled God as he journeyed through the natural world.*

He didn't imagine God as a far off spirit. He embraced God as a spirit he could see and touch right here, right now... "on earth as it is in Heaven".

I also spoke of Father Richard Rohr, a Franciscan Priest who created a non-profit called *Center for Action and Contemplation* (CAC). CAC is created and curated by a multi-denominational Board and staff. Among the many resources at CAC's website are podcasts, some of which are wonderful paths for understanding and discerning the Franciscan way. (One to consider is "*Everything Belongs!*") CAC can be found at <u>CAC.org</u>. I invite you to visit and begin.

We look back to understand, we look forward to live. See you over the next hill!


